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Featured Resource: Digital Research Tools (DiRT)

Recently added to the Libraries' <u>Linguistics Research</u>

<u>Guide</u> is the <u>Linguistic Research section of Digital</u>

<u>Research Tools</u> (DiRT). This online directory includes software, toolkits, and other programs to aid in linguistics research. These tools allow for everything from part-of-speech tagging, to annotating time series data, to plugins that provide morphological analysis of ancient languages on websites. Most are open-source.

Libraries Launch New Academic Integrity Tutorials

The Libraries have partnered with the office of <u>Student Judicial Affairs and Community Standards</u> to revamp the existing academic integrity tutorial, which many faculty members assign to their students.
