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Featured Resource: Digital Research Tools (DiRT)

Recently added to the Libraries' [Linguistics Research Guide](#) is the [Linguistic Research section of Digital Research Tools](#) (DiRT). This online directory includes software, toolkits, and other programs to aid in linguistics research. These tools allow for everything from part-of-speech tagging, to annotating time series data, to plugins that provide morphological analysis of ancient languages on websites. Most are open-source.

Libraries Launch New Academic Integrity Tutorials

The Libraries have partnered with the office of [Student Judicial Affairs and Community Standards](#) to revamp the existing academic integrity tutorial, which many faculty members assign to their students. The new tutorials are smaller and more modular, and both include a printable certificate certifying that students completed the tutorial and included quizzes. More will be added later in the year. 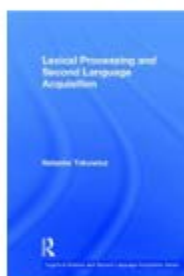

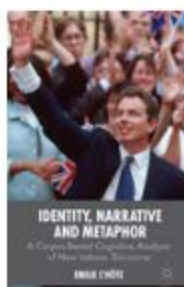
